What vaccine can I get?

Pfizer

Authorized 12 + years old two-dose vaccine - given 21 days apart Fully protected 2 weeks after the second dose

Moderna

Authorized 18 + years old two-dose vaccine - given 28 days apart Fully protected 2 weeks after the second dose

Johnson & Johnson

Authorized 18 + years old single dose vaccine Fully protected 2 weeks after the dose



Preparing for your Vaccine

- Vaccinations are FREE. You do not need insurance to receive your vaccine.
- Before you arrive, review your appointment confirmation for details about what identification and proof of eligibility you need to bring to your appointment.
- When you get the vaccine, you must wear a mask that cover your nose and mouth.
- After getting a COVID-19 vaccine, you should be monitored on site for at least 15 minutes.

Should I get vaccinated?

Covid-19 vaccinations are safe & effective

Vaccinations can protect you in many key ways

- it is highly effective at preventing COVID-19 & reducing symptoms from the virus
- Completing the vaccine series reduces your chances of hospitalization and lowers the risk of COVID-19
- Vaccinations protect people in the community from getting COVID-19, the more that are vaccinated make it harder for the disease to spread

Vaccination Benefits

- Fully vaccinated people, can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance.
- Vaccines prepare your immune system to be ready to fight the virus if you are exposed.
- Potential side effects of the vaccine are mild compared to full symptoms of COVID
- Vaccination safety is a top priority for CDC + WA DoH.
